Location: 27 Clarion Street, Westmont, Johnstown, Cambria County, Pa.

<u>Description</u>: The house has a front-gable roof with a recessed, lancet arch in the middle containing two one-over-one-light sash windows. The wood-framed house is a small, two-story, two-bay single-family house that sits at the top of a mound. Two sets of stairs lead to a hipped-roof front porch. Doric columns support the porch roof and are connected by a short balustrade of turned balusters. Wooden lattice-work covers the basement below the front porch. The house has horizontal wood on the first story with wood shingles in the gable.

<u>History</u>: This house was built in 1904-05. Arthur McKeever acquired this property from the Cambria Iron Company for \$700 on June 16, 1904. McKeever sold the lot later that year to William Oakley, who sold the property with a house constructed on it to Richard Blair McGahan for \$2,400 on February 24, 1905. Between 1904 and 1917 Thomas D. James rented the house. According to tax records for Westmont, James was a laborer and a mill hand until 1906 when he apparently was unemployed. In 1917 the house was rented to a clerk, R. E. Dudley.
