The Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art was founded in the mid-70s at St. Francis University in Loretto. The mission was to create an independent museum bringing American art to a broad and primarily rural area. SAMA did so by establishing three more locations including one at UPJ's Pasquerilla Performing Arts Center. Through January 7 visitors can take in the Allied Artists of Johnstown 78th Annual Juried Art Exhibition which includes Alan Rauch's "The Violinist." The permanent collection — which includes work by Mary Cassat, Frederick Childe Hassam, Grant Wood and Andy Warhol — may be seen at SAMA-Loretto. The two other locations are in Altoona and Ligonier.


The Bottle Works sustains and explores the region's rich ethnic heritage through the arts, food, costuming and handicrafts. Dedicated in 1996 as the Jacob and Renee Goldhaber Arts Center, the former Tulip Bottling Company in Cambria City was extensively renovated to provide a home for gallery, rehearsal and performance spaces. The Bottle Works hosts more than just exhibits and performances. Educational offerings held here include yoga, dance and cooking classes. Spaces may be rented by individuals and organizations. On permanent display is a history of Tulip soda and each bottle used in its production.

Art Works opened in 2007 to provide studio space for artists to work, teach, show and sell their pieces. Formerly a stable, the facility is registered with the U.S. Green Building Council and they hope to become the first in Johnstown to receive Gold Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design certification. Art Works offers the spaces for \$8/square foot, utilities included, to artists producing original work. Mid-career and older artists are asked to demonstrate ability in their medium through professional experience and/or exhibition in juried shows. Emerging artists are asked to present portfolio pieces and provide a mentor's reference.




The frog series came about following my time working as a newspaper photographer and exhibiting black and white work. I was looking for a new challenge. I found inspiration in the uniqueness of tree frogs and their vivid colors. My first successful photograph was the "Frog Standing on Leaf" (pictured here). A friend helped nudge the frog into position while I stood behind the camera, but on the third try the frog disappeared. "Where's the frog?" I asked, while still looking through the viewfinder. My friend responded, laughing: "He's on your camera!"

I really enjoyed the new challenge. I started looking for exotic and tropical flowers, and scouring specialty shops for miniatures to use as props in the studio. This marked the beginning of the "Frogs on Leaves and Flowers" and "Frogs on Wheels" series'. "Frogs on Wheels" expanded to include pictures of frogs with other miniatures, such as musical instruments and sporting equipment.

The frogs are unpredictable, and many times the final image isn't what I originally planned. In many cases, they're photographed in motion: the frogs crawl, climb, and jump, as frogs do. I just try to catch them at the right moment. When I'm successful, it looks like trick photography. But they're not composites or computer-generated images. The frogs are real—and so are the photographs.


STEVEN DANIEL

SAM HOWARD


Johnstown native, Sam Howard has won several awards, including first place in area juried shows. A self-taught artist, he did extensive studies of traditional painting methods which he incorporates with modern styles.

Sam's paintings explore the tension between realism and stylization as well as sentimentality and cynicism. An obvious question often asked of his art is "what does it mean?" And, although his work is created with a personal meaning in mind, he intends for the viewer to complete the painting through their own experiences. This feeling of narrative ambiguity, and a focus on mood is part of his admiration for the Surrealist and Symbolist movements.

He has been featured locally in exhibits at the former Satori Gallery in Moxham, VOMA in Cambria City, and will be featured at 28 West 2nd Street Gallery in Greensburg. He is a member of the Allied Artists of Johnstown and the Indiana Art Association.

(above) "M4d0nn4" (24 x 18); (below) "Sleepwalker" (20 x 16)




BRET SARLOUIS

Bret Sarlouis is a 28year old Geistown native Bishop McCort graduate, who "started painting landscapes, then fell in love with Van Gogh and Picasso." He trained as an actor at the New Theater at Saint Francis University, and subsequently began writing and producing plays. He most recently "Entitled" penned which was performed at the Bottle Works this past September. "I wrote 'Entitled' in two or three sittings. You just get taken over by whatever it is ... it's also about collaboration and co-creation with other creative people... who help refine the script

and the play itself through the (pre-production and performance) process."

VOMA

A group of residents from the Cambria City neighborhood banded together in 2008 to save a historically significant church and create a unique arts venue. The church was built in 1911, first to serve local Lebanese Christians as St. Mary's Syrian Orthodox Church and later, the Serbian Orthodox community as St. George's. The first floor affords gallery space to local artists while classes, lectures and musical performances are held downstairs. The venue hopes to soon make a recording studio available. VOMA was home to the three-day Cambria City Arts festival this past September and has also hosted a "salon and potluck" in which artists shared and discussed their own work, while breaking bread together.

Accessible and family-friendly, CACCC conducts classes and outreach programs for adults and children in addition to holding a variety of events — including the annual Log House Arts Festival. The Marcia Ponas Doll Museum is housed here and showcases over 800 dolls. Admission is free. The work of local and regional artists may be viewed in the Goldhaber-Fend Gallery and a juried exhibit with cash prizes is held annually. Holiday shoppers can browse crafts and new and used books at The Holly Bazaar through December 24. In the coming year, CACCC will also host a three-day book sale, their summer concert series, a community wildlife day and the Great American Auction. This year marks CACCC's 42nd anniversary.


MUSEUMS (JAHA)

There are a lot of other museum experiences in town that are great for entertaining guests or the kids on a rainy day. A ticket to the Johnstown Flood Museum costs less than \$10 is also good for admission to the Heritage Discovery Center and, seasonally, the Wagner-Ritter House and Garden. Both are located in Cambria City, a half mile from the Flood Museum. The Heritage Discovery Center alone is worth the admission. The third floor houses the Johnstown Children's Museum with its hands-on activities. The first floor explores immigrant life while other galleries feature temporary exhibits, a history of the steel industry, and items made in Johnstown.


The Wagner-Ritter House, just closed for the season, preserves the history of a working class family and allows visitors to experience 19th century life. It will re-open to the public April 1 but group tours may be arranged during the off-season. The Flood Museum is home to not only artifacts and the Academy Award-winning documentary, but also an example of temporary housing used to shelter survivors. The "Oklahoma House" was discovered in Moxham several years ago before being moved downtown to the museum and renovated.



"I think you can't have much human reaction without a sense of playfulness...



Someone once criticized my work, saying it was too playful. I said, that's hardly a criticism at all. I do see it as a compliment because I believe that without a sense of play, there's not much curiosity either. Even a scientist has a sense of play. And that allows for surprises, the unexpected, discoveries. Some people have got the idea that if it's boring, it's art, and if it's not boring it's not art. Well, I've always thought it was the other way around. If it's boring, more than likely it's not art. If it's fun and exciting, more than likely it is. I don't know any good art that's boring, in music, poetry or painting. Isn't that why Shakespeare is so exciting."

Eagle Screen Print and merican Embroidery has grown from one man to approximately 35 employees with a factory on Cover Hill and a retail/showroom in downtown Johnstown. They've produced imprinted and embroidered items for customers big and small — from local teams and organizations to licensed apparel for the likes of the Steelers and Penguins.

Owner Craig Hollern recently talked with 159 about how he started his business from scratch and established an American Eagle presence downtown.

In 1977, after graduating Greater Johnstown Vo-Tech, Hollern opened his first business, Athletic Silkscreen in Windber. In short order, he took his two-person shop to a five-person operation featuring state-of-art embroidery equipment. Hollern soon closed Athletic Silkscreen to enter into a partnership located in downtown Johnstown.

"At the time I went into the partnership, I had a strong production background but didn't have a lot of sales experience," Hollern said. His partner would bring needed sales skills to the new venture. They bought their first automatic screen printing machine, staffed up and continued to grow before Hollern sold his interest and eventually opened American Eagle Screen Print and Embroidery.

"I moved from downtown to my current location in Cover Hill, which is about a mile or so out of downtown Johnstown. And when I did that, I had to purchase all new equipment, all new supplies and start over fresh, from square one. I started with one automatic screen printing press, one four-headed embroidery machine and about ten employees. Today we have four automatic presses, five embroidery machines with 26 heads on them and about 35 staff."

Returning to downtown Johnstown was "a natural" for Hollern. "Back in the 70s, it was a booming town. You had Jupiter, Glosser's... Downtown has just been a mainstay throughout all that time and that's one of the reasons I wanted to get back into town." A downtown store and showroom would provide a high-traffic, high-visibility location to better serve customers. "Having had a business downtown and having worked [here], I realized that there are a lot of professional business people that work in the downtown area... the crime rate is low and there are a lot of things that make it a nice place to be." With his factory "off the beaten path," Hollern wanted a site where people could easily stop in to view samples, pick up a catalog and talk to a knowledgeable representative. "I saw the building on Franklin Street which was directly across from Central Park and knew it would be an ideal location."

Touring the building, Hollern also immediately saw the potential for loft-style apartments with views of Central Park, "it was a natural for me, that this building, with some effort, could be a really nice place in central, downtown Johnstown."

"I've had a good, positive experience," Hollern said of setting up shop downtown, "You just have to learn the process and requirements for locating a business in the city. Many people are also not necessarily aware of all of the resources available to them such as grant money for facade improvements..."

"There's a lot of things going on in the background. If they come to fruition, the City of Johnstown could see a renaissance—not just as a great place to work, but also to live... I do believe in the next ten years, there's going to be a big turnaround in the inner-city."

MOTHMAN SIGHTING IN JOHNSTOWN: BUG ZAPPERS BE DAMNED!

Have you ever been chased down by a "cryptid" with blazing red eyes, bat-like wings and a foreboding disposition just before some horrific tragedy struck? No? Me neither, but in the upcoming mockumentory, Mothman, we'll get first hand accounts of everyday citizens who have witnessed, shacked-up or partied with the cryptozoological creature.

The 20 minute film, produced and co-directed by Visual Element's Scott Cunningham and written/directed by Ruschelle Dillon, who penned the deliciously disturbing five minute short, Don't Punch the Corpse, (now on You Tube) will be released to film festivals throughout 2011.

When interviewed, Ruschelle was eager to share that Mothman is a mockumentory. A fan of all things cryptid and paranormal, Ruschelle enjoys finding the humor in the television programs that hunt down and uncover evidence on legendary creatures. When I asked the promising screen writer about the film's

inspiration, she replied, "As much as I love these shows, I can't help but recognize their absurdity so spoofing them is my fond homage."

The film is now in post production with Visual Element and will ready for national and international film festivals before the holidays. I raised


- 12 whole chicken wings

Sorry Jessica Simpson, Buffaloes do not have wings. However, the city up north that is home to the Sabers and the Bills does have wings. According to Wikipedia these wings that have become a part of American culinary history were created on October 3, 1964 by Teressa Belissimo when her son and a bunch of his friends showed up at the Anchor Bar, that she co-owned with her husband Frank. Realizing that she had to quickly feed ravenous college students before they started to pillage the walk-in cooler Teressa grabbed a bag of chicken wings, that had been slated for the next day's stock and threw them in the fryer. While the wings were frying, Teressa melted some butter and added hot sauce to it, and then tossed the cooked wings into the mixture.

Flash forward almost four decades and these creations that came as a result of a mother taking care of her son's munchies have found their way onto pretty much every bar menu around the country. There has been debate over how the wings should be fried. The first school

of thought (the one that I attest too) is that the wings should be thrown in the fryer naked

and left to become golden brown by themselves. While the other school of thought has you dredging the wings in flour before putting them in the fryer. Once the wings are fried, they become perfect for any number of sauces. Traditionalists hold that a true Buffalo
