What has nine sides, features a main structure that is 172 feet by 112 feet, and offers spectacular views of the campus? It's Pitt-Johnstown's new Wellness Center, which is currently under construction. Ground was broken for the facility on November 10.

President Jem Spectar presided over the groundbreaking ceremony and was joined by Howard M. Picking III, Pitt-Johnstown Advisory Board vice-chair and University of Pittsburgh Trustee, and Jeffrey Burtner, Student Government Association president.

In his remarks, President Spectar emphasized the importance of the facility. "Today we celebrate the groundbreaking for a new physical structure, but this will

be more than just a building. It will be a place where our students can explore the very important connection between the mind, body, and spirit."

The 40,000-square-foot facility, being constructed at a cost of \$9.7 million, will be connected to the Sports Center and will feature a three-lane, elevated running track, cardiovascular and strength-training equipment, dance/exercise/classroom space, two multipurpose courts for basketball and volleyball, and an indoor climbing wall. The facility will also include an outdoor wellness park. The facility is scheduled for completion in early 2011.




